## **Day for Life** *Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer - Romans 12:12*

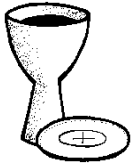

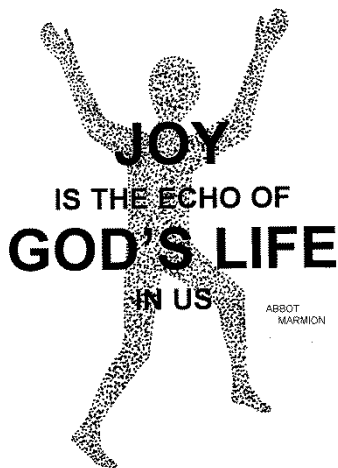
