Next Friday is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Novena to the Sacred Heart

O Divine Jesus, who said, "Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and the door shall be opened to you". Relying on these promises I come with confidence during this novena to ask of you the favours I need.

With a lively faith in you, I come to ask... (Share your petitions silently with the Sacred Heart.)

From whom shall we ask Lord Jesus, if not from you, whose heart is an unfailing source of grace and merits? Most loving heart of my God, I believe in your personal love for me, and therefore, O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in You.

We will be able to have public Masses from

Monday June 29th. It will be great to have people back at Mass. The WEBCAM has been a lifeline for our parishioners. And yet, virtual worship is just that. It is less than real. We will need to re-engage and reconnect. There is no substitute for attending Mass and receiving the Blessed Eucharist. For parishioners, particularly those who are cocooning, sick and aged, the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass remains. Indeed, many of our parishioners may wish to attend Mass on weekday this will also be necessary due to a decreased church capacity due to social distancing. I may put on some evening Masses as a trial to help with this.

We will have more details later ,at the moment.

A. Physical (Social) Distancing

Public health authorities advise that people should maintain physical distance from each other (currently at least 2 metres). In our churches this will mean that the maximum number of people who can be accommodated for any communal prayer or liturgy will be much reduced. The demands of physical distancing will also need to be considered in relation to people entering the church and leaving it.

B. Maintenance of Hygiene

While each person has individual responsibility for following advice on hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette, the church environment should itself be as safe as any enclosed public space. Priests and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitise their hands both before and after the distribution of Communion. And will wear a face-covering while distributing Communion. We will have more detailed information next week.

Confirmation

Bishop Deenihan will administer Confirmation at 11 a.m on Wednesday 12th of August in Kilbeggan. Due to Government restrictions this is for the 6th Class pupils of Scoil an Chlochair and Scoil, Kilbeggan and Scoil Aodha Naofa, Rahugh only.

First Communion

We will have First Holy Communion on Saturday 15th August in St. James' Church in Kilbeggan at 10 a.m. The boys and girls from Kilbeggan and Rahugh will be together.
