Pope Francis has sent a telegram for the death of Nadia de Munari, an Italian lay missionary of Operation Mato Grosso who died last Saturday after suffering a violent attack on Tuesday night. Nadia was attacked in her room at the "Mamma Mia" educational centre she ran in Nuevo Chimbote, Peru.



Pope Francis' telegram was sent as the community gathered for Nadia's

funeral.in it the Holy Father reiterated his firmest condemnation "for this new and unjustifiable episode of violence, which is added to the many others in which missionaries have lost their lives while performing, with self-denial, their service to the Gospel and assistance to the most needy and defenseless".

"While offering prayers for the eternal repose of the soul of this volunteer and entrusting her to the intercession of the Mother of God," the Pope expressed his "paternal closeness to her parents, family members and relatives. He assured his remembrance in prayer and his blessing upon all those participating in the ceremony in Peru ,and upon those who will participate in the funeral when Nadia's body will be finally brought back to Italy.

Nadia, from Vicenza (in northern Italy) worked. She ran 5 kindergartens and an elementary school: a service beneficial to more than 500 children from the shanty town of Nuevo Chimbote, which welcomes migrants in search of a living, who come down from the very poor villages of the Andes.
