Starting from May 2021 until the end of July 2022, the Society of Jesus celebrates the Ignatian year to remember the life of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits

The year will open on Thursday, 20 May which commemorates the 500th anniversary of St. Ignatius's injury during the Battle of Pamplona on 20 May 1521. While defending the citadel of Pamplona against French forces, St. Ignatius was seriously injured after being struck by a canon ball. This led to a long period of convalescence which began his conversion and subsequent transformation from soldier to saint.

During this year themed "to see all things new in Christ", the Jesuits will also mark the 400th anniversary of the canonization of St. Ignatius and St. Francis Xavier on 12 March 2022. The Ignatian year will conclude on 31 July 2022 – the Feast of St. Ignatius. The solemn opening Mass for the Ignatian year takes in Pamplona, Spain on Thursday, 20 May 2021.

The Ignatian year "is a call to allow the Lord to work on our conversion," said Fr. Arturo Sosa SJ, Superior General of the Jesuits. "We ask for the grace to be renewed by the Lord.
