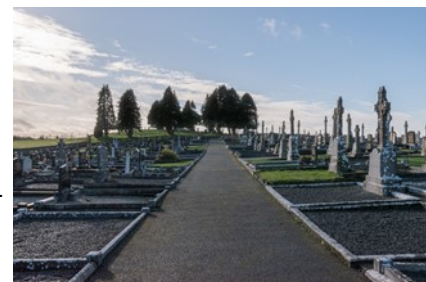


A new Internal Displacement Monitoring Center (IDMC) states in 2020, about 48 million people were uprooted from their homes as a result of violence and conflict, while another 7 million were displaced by disasters. Of this number, about 20 million displaced persons are children under the age of fifteen, and 2.6 million over 65. An estimated 10.5 million are between the ages of 15 and 24, while the age group with the largest number of IDPs are those between 25 and 64, with about 22 million people. Providing some context to the displacements, the report released on Thursday pointed to escalating violence from extremist groups in countries like Ethiopia, Mozambique and Burkina Faso last year. At the same time, long-standing conflicts in places like the Democratic Republic of Congo, Syria and Afghanistan continue to cause large numbers to flee.

## **Bishop Deenihan has now organised Confirmation for 7.30p.m. July 15th in St. James' Church Kilbeggan.**

It is great that girls and boys will be able to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before they start in Secondary School. Confirmands will be able to bring three people and themselves to the ceremony, i.e. themselves, 2 parents, and a sponsor, making a total of four. It is a simple ceremony with no Mass.
