What is the Pope saying about "Latin Mass"..."Tridintine Mass "

A brief explanation

The Pope has published the Motu proprio "Traditionis Custodes," dated 16 July 2021, regarding the use of the Roman liturgy prior to 1970 . He attached a letter with it to explain his reasons. The Latin Mass he is speaking about is the Mass is the Latin Mass formulated as a result of the Council of Trent in 1570, therefore called the Tridintine Mass. It was celebrated by the priest with his back to the people., much of it silently. The congregation was mostly passive. The first reforms of the Second Vatican Council

was in Liturgy and Ecclesiology, how we celebrate Mass and the nature of the Church. This reform meant that we all share the priesthood of Christ, and we are all participants in the Mass, so priest and people are gathered around the altar. The Mass is said in the language of the people and they can join in the prayers and understand them and the readings. The Mass is said with a congregation and not by a priest on his own. At the end of the council it was agreed that elderly and ill priest could continue to offer the Tridintine Mass to the end of their day.

Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict in an attempt to created unity with those who had not stayed in the Church allowed the use of the Tridintine Mass, but unfortunately, this became a focal point for those who wished to voice objections to the Vatican Council and its reforms and teaching which was promulgated with Peter, under Peter and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Many who were promoting the Tridintine Mass made claims it was holier or better, thus causing division. Pope Francis consulted with the bishops of the world and as a result made this decision.
