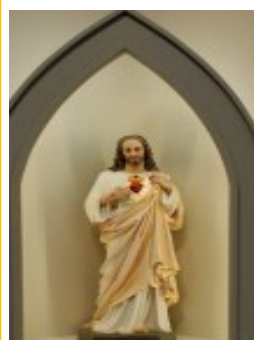

It is wonderful to be able to celebrate Mass in Rahugh again. The last time we had a public Mass here was on the 8th of March 2020 . The Church is nicely painted for the occasion. Our First Mass is the First Communion Mass on 11th Sept.

We ask those coming to Mass in Rahugh to follow a few instructions which will keep everyone safe.

- ◆ Follow the instructions of the stewards
- ◆ Sanitise hands at entrances
- ◆ Wear a mask
- ◆ Spread out in the church giving everyone adequate space
- ◆ Follow instructions for coming to receive Holy Communion, which will be given at Mass.
- ◆ Seats will need to be sanitised after Masses
- ◆ The Altar Society needs to be re-established for cleaning the Church.
- ◆ A new rota for Readers and Ministers of the Eucharist will be established for October.
- ◆ There are no collection during Mass, please place your envelopes and contributions in the containers at the doors.
