We contributed €1,180 from the parish to the Missions last week. “It is time to focus on what unites us and not on what divides us.”

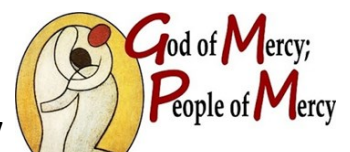

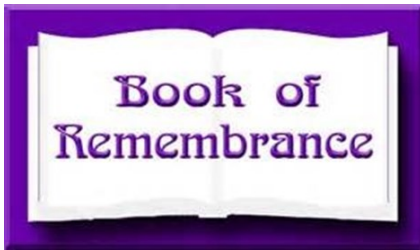
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament After 9.30 a.m.

## Our Collection Today will be given to Trocaire to help 30 Million people

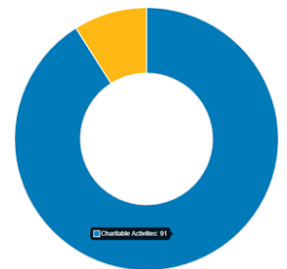
The Bishops of Ireland have called for a national Church collection on the 6th and 7th of November to support Trócaire in providing life-saving aid to vulnerable communities in East Africa and DRC, where millions of people are being pushed to the edge of starvation.

Already over 30 million vulnerable people, including children, are affected and the scale of this hunger crisis is unprecedented. With the world's focus on local issues and concerns, and resources for humanitarian response more thinly spread than ever, the plight of those in East Africa and DRC remains largely hidden.

Trócaire is the overseas development agency of the Catholic Church in Ireland. The work that we do is done in your name and is possible only because of your support.

91% of Trócaire's money is used for the poor, 9% is used to raise money.



Overwork and work-related stress cause many people to experience extreme exhaustion — mental, emotional, affective, and physical exhaustion. Sadness, apathy, and spiritual tiredness end up dominating people's lives, who are overloaded due to the rhythm of life today.

Let us try to be close to those who are exhausted, to those who are desperate, without hope. Often, we should just simply listen in silence, because we cannot go and tell someone, "No, life's not like that. Listen to me, I'll give you the solution." There's no solution. And besides, let us not forget that, along with the indispensable psychological counselling, which is useful and effective, Jesus' words also help. It comes to my mind and heart: "Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."
