In his homily during Holy Mass in the Carmelite Monastery in Auschwitz, Cardinal Czerny to mark the 80th Anniversary of the death of Edith Stein, later Canonised St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, spoke of his own grandmother's death in Auschwitz at the same time as St. Benedicta. Edith was a student of philosophy and a Jew. She converted to Catholicism and became a Carmelite nun.

"The suffering imposed on the Ukrainian and Russian populations, the ever more numerous refugees and victims, oblige us to remember the Holocaust. The Holocaust must help us to seriously question the path taken by humanity

since the end of the World War II, nearly eight decades ago," he said. For this reason, the Cardinal went on to say, quoting Psalm 118, "in order to scrutinise the past, so that we can better understand the present and commit ourselves to the future, we need to illuminate it with the Word of God, a lamp for our steps and a light for our path."

On the afternoon of 2 August 1942, two Gestapo agents knocked on the door of the Carmelite monastery in Echt to apprehend Edith Stein, also known, as Sister Teresa Benedicta, together with her sister Rosa. Her fate was sealed when she was taken to the Westerbork sorting camp in the north of Holland, and then deported with many others to the Auschwitz-Birkenau extermination camp.

On 9 August, 1942 Sr Teresa Benedicta of the Cross died in the gas chambers of the camp. In 1945 Cardinal Czerny's grandmother Anna Hayek née Löw died in the camp also.
