What can I do in Advent to prepare for Christmas?

Pray More. You could pray the Rosary daily, read in the Bible each day, or spend more time in personal prayer, just talking with God. Visit the church and spend some time with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Go to Mass More. Attending Mass more often helps us to keep our focus on God during Advent-and less on the societal consumerism of Christmas.

Go to Confession. One of the best ways to prepare our hearts is to open them to God's mercy and forgiveness. Confession frees us from burdens, and helps us to get our hearts in the right place in regards to others and ourselves.

Give More. You might like to help some charity for Christmas or share with someone you know could do with some help.

Visit More. Is there someone you could visit in a nursing home, or in their own home. Have time for others, especially those who might be lonely.


Pray as Family more. For faith to be passed on prayer is essential. Faith is a relationship with God, and family prayer makes this relationship real.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation Instead of a Penitential Service at Christmas I will provide Confes-

sions after every Mass during Advent. This will give people many opportunities in the week to go to Confessions along with the Saturday Confessions 10.30 -11.30a.m. There is also Confessions available in neighbouring parishes. It is thought that the Penitential Services, took away from the Sacrament, and made them less of a personal encounter with the Father the source of all Mercy. They also tended to trivialise the true nature of sin. Most parishes now have individual Confessions instead of the Penitential Service.
