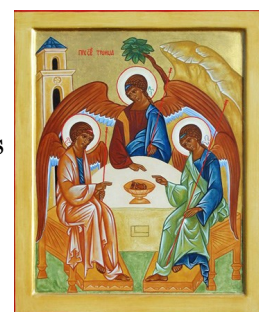

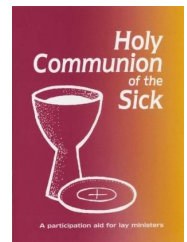

The Death Penalty 883 killed. Amnesty International has released a report stating that a total of 883 people are known to have been put to death across 20 countries, in 2022, marking a rise of 53% compared to 2021. The figures exclude some countries that are thought to carry out executions but where figures are unavailable because data on the death penalty is classified.

Catechism of the Catholic Church: "the Church teaches, in light of the gospel, that 'the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and the dignity of the person.'" With change in the Catechism in 2018 and Pope Francis's binding teachings in Fratelli Tutti in 2020, the faithful are today morally obliged to oppose the death penalty, may not promote or support executions, and may not in good conscience endorse laws that allow capital punishment.

At our recent P.P.A. meeting, we spent time reflecting on Pope Francis' words about the Joy of the Gospel. His exhortation tells us: "Before all else, the Gospel invites us to respond to the God of love who saves us, to see God in others and to go forth from ourselves to seek the good of others." On this feast of Pentecost, we are called to be fully open to the Gifts and Fruits of the Spirit, received at our Baptism and Confirmation, so that we can grow as a Christian community and share God's love with all we meet.
