This year, the **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly** takes place Sunday 23 July – the Sunday closest to the **Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Grandparents of Jesus**. The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year’s celebration is: **“His mercy is from age to age” (Luke 1:50) ...**“Let us remember that our life is meant to be lived to the full, and that our greatest hopes and dreams are not achieved instantly but through a process of growth and maturation, in dialogue and in relationship with others.
