In last Sunday's Gospel the Merchant has three actions seeking, finding and buying. They can speak to us about our ways of living.

“Let us then resume the merchant’s three actions: seeking, finding and buying – and ask ourselves some questions. Seeking: am I searching, in my life? Do I feel fine, accomplished, am I satisfied, or do I exercise my desire for good? Am I in spiritual retirement? How many young people are in retirement! The second action, finding: do I practise discerning what is good and comes from God, knowing how to renounce what leaves me with little or nothing? Finally, buying: do I know how to spend myself for Jesus? Is He in first place for me, is He the greatest good in life? It would be nice to say to Him today: “Jesus, You are my greatest good”. World Youth Day 1st - 6th August 2023

Bishop Tom and forty-four young pilgrims travel to Lisbon for this eagerly anticipated world gathering with Pope Francis. The week begins on Tuesday with the Opening Mass being celebrated in the city centre. On the following days across Lisbon the youth will attend Rise Up Encounters, a series of talks, discussions, prayer and reflections. In the evenings there are a variety of cultural, religious and festival events to celebrate the joy of this global gathering of young Catholics. On Thursday evening Pope Francis will preside over the Welcome Ceremony and on Friday afternoon he will guide the pilgrims in the Way of the Cross. The pilgrims on Saturday set out on a 10k pilgrimage walk to the site of the WYD Papal Prayer Vigil and Mass on Sunday, the Feast of the Transfiguration. At the conclusion of this WYD Mass Pope Francis will bless the youth for the ongoing Mission which we all share as the witnesses to Christ, under the protection of Our Lady of Fatima.
