
We have a wide selection of new summer clothing, household goods and bric-a-brac. Much of the clothing is brand new and never worn. There is also a wide selection of shoes.

In 2015, Pope Francis published Laudato Si' – On Care for Our Common Home, the first papal encyclical on care for creation. It became a best seller in Ireland and in many countries. Laudato Si' is a blueprint which encourages "every person living on this planet" (LS, 3) to listen to the signs of the times, to the cry of the earth and the cry of the

poor, to listen to the science and to the call of our faith. In Laudato Si' we read that, "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience." The **Universalis App** is a breviary and a missal for your phone or iPad/tablet which gives you:

- A full liturgical calendar so that you know all the saints' days and feasts.
- **All the readings and prayers for Mass** so you can follow them in church or read them at home, with or without commentary/reflections on the daily Mass readings.
- The About Today page to tell you about the saints of the day, and more.
- Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office) which is the official prayer of the Church offered at various times of the day and not only reserved for priests and religious, but can also be prayed by the lay faithful.
- Lectio Divina for private or shared meditation.
- The Rosary
- One purchase covers all your iPhone, iPod, iPad / Tablet touch devices.

Once downloaded, it doesn't need an Internet connection, so you can use it anywhere at any time. It can be purchased for €12 from the usual App stores (Google Play Store for Android phones, or the App Store for Apple iPhone). It lasts for ever and you never need to pay again. To try before you buy, you can get the 'Catholic Calendar:Universalis' app for a free 30-day trial/preview or go to universalis.com and select 'free trial' for your particular gadget. After that, you can choose whether you want to buy—there is no obligation to purchase.
