Eulogies at Funeral Masses When a person dies the Funeral Mass is offered for the repose of the deceased. The Mass is a time of prayer asking the Lord's mercy for the person who has died, and to pray they may be welcomed into heaven. It is not a "celebration" of the persons life. A different venue is more suitable for such a celebration. It is important to protect the Mass as a time of prayer so that it is not used for something else. Some may feel that they

would like to speak at Mass, but the priest cannot make exceptions, all are treated the same. There is an opportunity to speak in the Cemetery, or in the Parish Centre. The biggest reason for this ruling is to protect the Mass, but, also, the priest cannot be responsible for what someone might say. I always try to personalise the homily at each Funeral Mass. Many have been deeply hurt by what is said in eulogies after Holy Communion, and it can highlight publicly divisions in families. I would like to thank the catering committees in Kilbeggan and Rahugh for their work of service to the bereaved.

Mass Stipends and how the Canon Law is applied. A stipend is the money received by the priest for offering Mass. A priest can keep six stipends in a week for his personal upkeep. Each week Mass is offered for the people but no stipend is received by the priest. If at the weekend there are a number of intentions for the one Mass, I offer the



Mass for them all, and then during the week I offer an individual Mass for each separate intention at the daily Mass. Any extra stipends go to the Diocese for the care of retired priests. Extra intentions for whom I cannot say Mass e.g. Mass Cards are sent to the Missions for priests to offer the Masses. If a person cannot afford a stipend Mass is said without the stipend. There is no charge for any sacrament., or Funeral Masses. A person can give an offering they can afford if they wish for the income of the priest.
