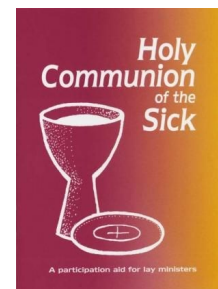
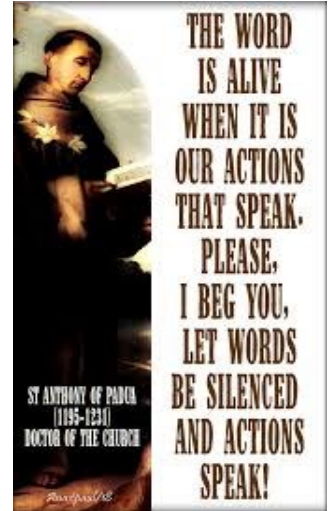

### Parish Charity Shop

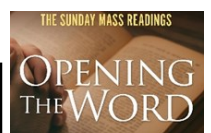
We have a wide selection of new autumn and winter clothing, household goods and bric-a-brac. Much of the clothing is brand new and never worn.

**Kilbeggan. Families are invited to come along and remember prayerfully, loved ones who have gone to their eternal reward.**

During the month of November there will be a place for families to leave the names of the dead in the sanctuary – they will be remembered at Masses during the month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls.

## **Indulgences for the Faithful Departed From 12 noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November**

By visiting a church or oratory and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed, One Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls, may be gained, by all those who:

Have confessed (at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November)

Received Holy Communion (any day from 1-8 Nov)

Prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father, and Hail Mary or any other prayer of one's choice)

1 — 8 November

The Faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain One Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls.

The above conditions regarding Confession, Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions apply also for this.

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (Paul VI, Apostolic Constitution, Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 1).

"An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin" (Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 2; Cf. Norm 3). The faithful can gain Indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead (Code of Canon Law, can. 994).
