Penitential Service 7.30 p.m. Tuesday 26th March

At Baptism we were freed from sin, we remember our Baptism at Easter in the Easter Vigil. The Penitential Service is a good time to make a confession of our sins and receive forgiveness, healing and strength. Our faith teaches us that "Sin is before all else an offense against God, a rupture of communion with him. At



the same time it damages communion with the Church. For this reason conversion entails both God's forgiveness and reconciliation with the Church, which are expressed and accomplished liturgically by the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

1441 Only God forgives sins. Since he is the Son of God, Jesus says of himself, "The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" and exercises this divine power: "Your sins are forgiven." Further, by virtue of his divine authority he gives this power to men to exercise in his name.

1442 Christ has willed that in her prayer and life and action his whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation that he acquired for us at the price of his blood. But he entrusted the exercise of the power of absolution to the apostolic ministry which he charged with the "ministry of reconciliation." The apostle is sent out "on behalf of Christ" with "God making his appeal" through him and pleading: "Be reconciled to God." **Catechism of the Catholic Church.**
