



Mass commemorating those who have died in the past 12 months will be celebrated on Sunday 3rd November at

9.30 a.m. in Rahugh and 11 a.m. in Kilbeggan. Families are invited to come along and remember prayerfully, loved ones who have gone to their eternal reward.

During the month of November there will be a place for families to leave the names of the dead in the sanctuary – they will be remembered at Masses during the month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls.

Indulgences for the Faithful Departed: From 12 noon on 1 Nov. until midnight on 2 November

By visiting a church or oratory and there reciting one **Our Father** and the **Apostle's Creed**, one Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls, may be gained, by all those who:

- Have **confessed** (at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November)
- Received **Holy Communion** (any day from 1-8 Nov)
- **Prayed for the Pope's intentions** (one *Our Father*, and *Hail Mary* or any other prayer of one's choice)

1 — 8 November: The Faithful who **visit a cemetery** and **pray for the dead** may gain One Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls. The above conditions regarding **Confession, Holy Communion** and **Prayed for the Pope's intentions** apply also for this.

What is an Indulgence ?

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (Paul VI, Apostolic Constitution, Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 1).

"An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin" (Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 2; Cf. Norm 3). The faithful can gain Indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead (Code of Canon Law, can. 994). From Catechism of the Catholic Church, no 1471
