Open Day for Mullingar Cathedral Choristers Saturday 16th November

Boys from parishes across the Diocese of Meath interested in joining the Cathedral Choristers (boys' choir) are invited to join an open day at 3pm on Saturday, November 16th. This event is open to any boy in or above 3rd class of primary school who would like to learn more about being a Chorister at Mullingar Cathedral.



Boys with a basic ability to sing as well as more experienced boys are encouraged to explore this excellent chance to develop not only their voice but to nurture a life-long skill, make strong friendships, build their confidence and self-esteem, and represent their community. As part of the event, boys will spend the afternoon doing some group and individual singing with the group's Director, and tour Mullingar Cathedral, including the museum and organ loft.

Parents are warmly welcome to join for tea and coffee and to learn more about the Choristers' unique opportunities and meet the team who take great care of them at the Cathedral. Both attendance and application to join the Choristers is free of charge. The Choristers sing at the Cathedral's 12:30 pm Sunday Mass in the autumn and at the 11am one in January, as well as other events throughout the year. The UN Children's Fund, UNICEF, decries that millions of children are suffering violence globally each year, and sounds the alarm that every four minutes, somewhere in the world, a child is killed by an act of violence.

Specifically, it states, 650 million girls and women, representing one in five alive today, were subjected to sexual violence as children. This includes, it noted, over 370 million, marking about 1 in 8, who experienced rape or sexual assault. In fragile settings, it points out, girls face an even greater risk, with the prevalence of rape and sexual assault in childhood slightly more than one in four. It adds that nearly 50 million adolescent girls aged 15-19, representing one in six, have been victims of physical or sexual violence by their husbands or partners in the past year. Moreover, it states that 410 to 530 million boys and men, which is around one in seven, experienced sexual violence in childhood, including 240 to 310 million, who were raped or sexually assaulted.
