Mass commemorating those who have died in the past 12 months, and all those on our Parish List of the Dead, will be celebrated at the Vigil

Mass and Sunday Masses next weekend. Families are invited to come along and remember prayerfully, loved ones who have gone to their eternal reward. During the month of November there will be a place for families to leave the names of the dead in the sanctuary – they will be remembered at Masses during this month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls, and on First Fridays throughout the year.

Indulgences for the Faithful Departed From 12 noon on 1 November until midnight on 2 November by visiting a church or oratory and there, reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. One Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls, may be gained, by all those who:

- Have confessed (at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November)
- Received Holy Communion (any day from 1-8 Nov)
- Pray for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father, and Hail Mary or any other prayer of one's choice)

1 — 8 November The Faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain One Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls. The above conditions regarding Confession, Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions apply also for this.

What is an Indulgence ? "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (Paul VI, Apostolic Constitution, Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 1).

"An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin" (Indulgentiarum doctrina, Norm 2; Cf. Norm 3). The faithful can gain Indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead (Code of Canon Law, can. 994). *From Catechism of the Catholic Church, no 1471.*

Pope Leo's prayer intention for November: *For the prevention of suicide*

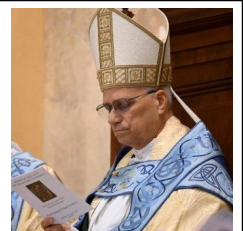


Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network

It is only the resurrected Jesus who can give the true and lasting peace that sustains and fills us.
