SPECIAL REMEMBRANCE MASS FOR THOSE WHO DIED IN THE PAST YEAR SATURDAY 22nd NOVEMBER 7.30 P.M.

We will have a Mass of remembrance for those who have died in the past year. We will have a candle for each family so that they can bring it to the altar at the Mass and place it on a table before the altar. Could each family decide who will carry up the lighted candle to the altar while the name of the deceased is read out. Ordination to the Priesthood Reverend Anthony Kerr will be Ordained to the Priesthood on Saturday, November 29th at 2pm in the Cathedral, Mullingar. This is a significant event in the life of Anthony and in the life of the Diocese. Anthony is a native of Navan. All are welcome to the Ordination.

SYCAMOR Esessions, which will help you engage with your faith. It starts on Tuesday 18th November at 7.30 p.m.


