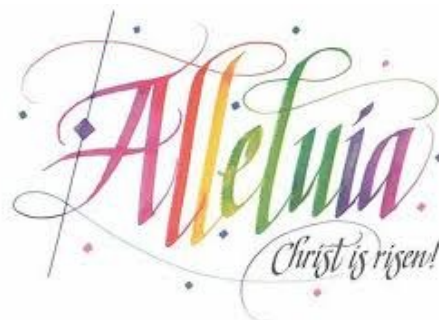

**Alleluia** means "Praise the Lord!" and it rings throughout the year. We give praise to God with this single word. It is a word of rejoicing which comes from the Old Testament and is used now as a shout of joy for the Resurrection of Jesus. One of the most beautiful pieces of music composed and performed during Easter is the "Halleluiahs Chorus" of Handel's Messiah. Composed in August 1741 by George Frideric Handel.
